No club tools are to leave the property, and should be put away in their correct places after work parties, etc. Marine Registrar Don Rizzo: it is a member obligation to have a current copy of the declaration page of your vessel liability insurance filed at the clubhouse. The policy must include PYC as an additional insured as follows: Peekskill Yacht Club, 1 Travis Point, Peekskill, NY 10566. Members may mail the page to the clubhouse, fax it to Don at 914-739-9705 or contact him for other options.

Al Scannapieco and Al DeGaetano: members must fill out and return to either of them the Peekskill Yacht Club Boat and Watercraft Info form available at the clubhouse. Report to Al any new boat coming into the yard. And for billing purposes, report any changes in boat size, purchase or disposal to PC Dennis McCoskey.

PYC must use its separate containers for garbage and trash; commingled glass, plastic and metal containers; and cardboard and paper to avoid sanctions by the city. Dumpsters are marked so be certain to use the right one.

PC Tom Radocaj has membership ID cards for any member without one. An ID card may be invaluable should you want — or need — help from another club in the Hudson River Boat & Yacht Club Association.

Treasurer PC Tom O'Connor: members seeking reimbursement for club-related expenses must sign the bill or receipt with a legible signature. And Chuck Newman wants us to print our name. Either way...make it legible!

PLEASE DO NOT bring stuff into the yard "for the club" unless you talk to a board member first to determine if the club can use it. Also **don't hang anything from the new fence**. It can damage our reputation.



Peekskill Yacht Club Members Share Long History of Teamwork, Community Service and Robust Social Calendars

The nearly 130 members of Peekskill Yacht Club (PYC) are justifiably proud of their accomplishments during more than 100 years at Travis Point on the Hudson River. One of the oldest clubs on the Hudson, it is a model for many other working clubs.

As a working club, members have their hands in every aspect of the operation. With a spacious and full-service clubhouse, basin with 84 slips and a dozen personal watercraft ports; a large storage yard and members-only gas dock and pump-out station, there's always plenty of work for everyone.

Members build and repair club docks and bulkhead; cook meals and tend bar at meetings and social events; clean the clubhouse; cut the grass; operate the TraveLift to launch and pull boats; maintain all electrical, security and plumbing systems; operate the gas dock; archive club history; publish a club newsletter; and even support a club band for entertainment.

Working closely together to maintain club facilities, members from many backgrounds build friendships that enhance the value and rewards of membership. A diverse group -- from first responders and educators to businessmen and political leaders – the club's membership reflects all segments of the community.

To remain in good standing, each member must complete a minimum number of work hours each year. Such efforts typically will focus on tasks requiring their special skills and preferences. For example, a member with carpentry skills would likely help build docks while someone without specific trade skills might help clean the clubhouse, painting, organize events, yard work or other general maintenance. Those with musical talents might chose to join the club band, The Work Hours.

In 2020 members took advantage of the COVID-19 closure of the clubhouse for all activities to paint its entire interior, refurbish utilities, and replace all carpeting that had been in place since the building opened in 2000. Masked, they spent many hours completing the project.

Members who know their way around a kitchen are always welcome. Prior to monthly meetings the galley crew serves up a meal that can't be beat: salad, main course, drink and desert for just \$5. Breakfast and lunch are often served at no charge during major work parties. And great meals are served at modest cost for families and friends during holiday events throughout the year and seasonal Tiki Bar happy hours on the dock.

We are also proud to have hosted Sea Scout Ship 30 for many years. The scouts use our clubhouse for meetings where they learn skills needed to navigate the Hudson and attend safe boating classes. The scouts also join in the ceremonies and festivities during our annual Commissioning the Fleet Day event.

Club members are often first responders when there are emergencies on the river. During the boating season club members keep a marine radio tuned to Ch. 16 so that when a distress call comes in we are able to respond and provide aid.

PYC has always supported City of Peekskill activities. As early as 1909, club members were part of the Hudson-Fulton Celebration on the 300th anniversary of Henry Hudson's discovery of the Hudson River. The club regularly participates in city parades, celebrations and fund raisers such as Toys for Tots and Turkey Trots.

This <u>Peekskill Light</u> includes current examples of PYC member commitment to Teamwork (Docks Out Work Party); Community Service (Turkey Trot) and robust Social Calendar (Christmas Party and Oktoberfest).

The club helps care for the city docks both at the Riverfront Green and boat launch, and hosts the city police boat in the yard where about a dozen transient boats are stored each winter. And the US Coast Guard Auxiliary meets in the PYC clubhouse, as does the city Garden Club. The club also hosts Red Cross blood drives in the clubhouse.

PYC's archives date the club's inception to 1903 when local residents joined to share their interest in boating. Chartered in 1908, the club in 1915 moved to Travis Point, one of the many beautiful spots on the Hudson. From the clubhouse the view is northwest across the Hudson to the South Gate of the Highlands, Dunderberg Mt. and Anthony's Nose.

Members of Peekskill Yacht Club maintain their clubhouse and grounds, teach safe boating, preserve club history, serve the local community, support the local economy and enjoy a robust social calendar. New members are welcome. Those who want to learn more about the club or to inquire about membership may go to the club's website.





Selected from minutes reported by Vice Commodore Tony Spadaro

November 9, 2022

- Correspondence: Garden Club request for December clubhouse dates were read and approved; Rob Mione request for the clubhouse use on Feb. 25 was approved; the official calendar for the clubhouse should be the one in the executive lounge; the calendar of events in the display case should agree with the one in the executive lounge to avoid conflicting club and private requests for clubhouse use.
- Financial Secretary Report: Winter storage bills were sent to members who have not paid.
- T PC Tom O'Connor: Treasurer's report read and approved.
- VC Tony Spadaro: Reporting for Cmdr. Dave Hylka (recovering from COVID) that he would get notarized and mail the Button estate documents this week; Walter Button's will and gift to PYC was discussed; the will was sent to a para legal for review (PC Denis McCoskey); it was recommended to move forward and accept the gift of \$114,467.11; the board appointed Cmdr. Dave Hylka as its representative to sign and notarize.
- FC John Macko: Working with Chrissy on upcoming events.
- Gas and Vending: Matt Henry, if you owe money, pay up so we can close out the books.
- Membership: Tony Washington voted to active membership; Sheldon Proctor and John Richardson voted to associate membership.
- PC Rudy Spadaro: Make sure to look at tractor warning lights; running the tractor with warning lights could ruin it; don't run the tractor if you don't know what you are doing.
- Recycling: Reported recycle cash.
- VC Tony Spadaro: The light in the parking lot was repaired.
- RC Al Scannapieco: There is a little time remaining to work on the pit and breakwater;
 these projects are key to the club's existence; it would be good if we could get a crew to
 work on the breakwater before we need to take the barges out; it was suggested that a
 crew could take the boards up in select areas by the Tiki Bar ahead to allow a second crew
 to replace worn poles supporting the area.
- Breakwater: Weather permitting, will replace poles in thee Tiki Bar area before taking the barges out; looking for volunteers to remove decking to gain access to drive poles in and man the barge crew.

- Carpentry: All docks in, working to repair docks.
- Chuck Newman: Reported on Turkey Trot.
- DEP: All up to date.
- RC Al Scannapieco: All docks out of the water; best time of the year for the dockmaster.
- Docks & Floats, PC Robby Teichman: All docks out of the water; repairs are being made to dock next to the shed in the yard.
- Work Hours: Please publish.
- Yardmaster Al DeGaetano: The yard is in good shape and the barges are out of the water.

Old Business

- Gas pump situation was discussed; the current system is old and failing; PC Tom O'Connor reviewed a quote from American Petroleum for a new pump reader, tax and a new computer for \$25,000; Tom also indicated that he received a quote for similar components, installation and tax from Gas Boy about \$10,000 more. Robby Teichman indicated that his contact was even higher; motion was made and passed to spend \$25,000 for new equipment; the club will continue to charge members \$.25 per gallon above cost.
- Wade and Ray mentioned that the oil waste tank needs to be pumped and that it would cost about \$400 plus extra charge by the gallon for contaminants other than oil; typically there would be about 20 or so gallons of contaminant; general consensus is this needs to be done regardless of cost.

New Business

- Ray said there is a need for a new pressure washer and asked the club for \$2500; PC
 Rudy said this was not necessary as the pressure washer was repaired and running; VC
 Tony asked Ray to investigate the need and come back with a proposal if necessary.
- PC Tom O'Connor presented information on ways to obtain interest on our money in the bank; he indicated that on average we would need to keep an operating balance of \$20,000 allowing us to invest the rest of the money residing in checking; the matter was discussed and it was agreed that Scott Rubin, PC Tom and Don Rizzo would further investigate and report to the board and club.
- Dark Horse, Ship's Store winners were read; Sunshine was announced.

October 10, 2022

- Minutes of the Board Meeting on Oct. 5 were read for information only; minutes of the General Membership Meeting of Sept. 14 were read and accepted.
- Correspondence, RS Ted Brackenrig: Al DeGaetano requested use of the clubhouse on Nov. 27, 6-11 pm; for surprise birthday party; approved by the membership.
- Treasurer, PC Tom O'Connor: Details of the Oct. 5 financial report were read in the minutes of the Oct. 5 Board Meeting.; current bank balances were read; anyone wanting to see a breakdown of expenditures should see Tom.
- FS, PC Dennis McCoskey: Not present but asked that members please pay their winter storage fees promptly.
- Cmdr. Dave Hylka: The Riverkeeper meeting was very informative; spoke with one of the
 representatives about having a day where PYC helps clean up he river; striper slip a good
 idea; fixed docks would be utilized; he will check on the insurance liability but it would be a
 good source of revenue; dink docks Saturday at 8:30 am; Al DeGaetano and otters have
 been pulling boats and we are ahead of schedule.
- VC Tony Spadaro: Some people are getting to work parties late when most of the work is
 done; but there is a lot of work that can be done without a work party (mowing lawn,
 weed whacking, etc.); so if anyone says they are having an issue remind them of this; he
 will put together a list of such tasks and they will be available for members without having
 a full work party; committee chair suggestions will be added to the list.
- RC Al Scannapieco: Boats are coming out and all need to be out by Nov. 1 including those
 on the fixed dock; if your boat is coming out, check the schedule and get your request on it
 so we don't have conflicts; docks coming out Nov. 5; please check the equipment for oil
 before use.
- Cmdr. Dave Hylka: Thanked Frank Pugliese for excellent meal; Frank said he and crew will provide breakfast and lunch on Nov. 5, docks out day.
- Yard Master, Al DeGaetano: A hose blew in the pressure washer, will try to repair
 ASAP; boom truck was out of diesel; we received a delivery from Eastern Oil today; when
 pulling your boat, check with him as to where your spot is; we are moving things around so
 it may not be the same as last year; ahead of time, make sure the spot is clear and have
 your jack stands ready (in place and lubricated); described the best way to level the boat.

- Docks & Floats: Got a lot of work done on the fixed cocks on Saturday getting everything ready for pulling the boats out.
- Entertainment: A great party this past weekend; had a full house; thanks to the kitchen crew; chili cook-off is cancelled due to lack of entries; Halloween Party RSVPs are going out; please respond promptly as it helps the planning.
